




Reminders And Information May 2013

KNOW YOUR CITY CODE

We are using this section of our newsletter to familiarize residents with content found in the official City Code book. We will periodically print selected sections. See back for additional City Code. For a full version of the City's Code, please visit www.mountainpark-ga.gov. The City of Mountain Park has adopted as its Animal Control Ordinance, the Fulton County Animal Control Ordinance.



Animal Ordinance:

- Generally – running at large dogs, domestic animals , etc., dangerous or potentially dangerous dogs is prohibited with the exception of cats.
- Dogs – unlawful for owner, custodian or harbinger of any dog to allow such dog to leave the premises or the owner or other such person having custody unless dog is under security of leash being no more than 6 feet in length and under the control of a competent person. Dogs must be confined to the premises of the owner or other person having custody and must be restrained by means of a fence or wall or other enclosure.
- Restraint of domestic animals – it shall be unlawful for owner, custodian or harbinger of any domestic animal to allow or permit such animal to leave the premises of the owner or other person having custody unless securely under leash, carry case or restrained by some other means and under the control of a competent person.

COUNCIL MEETINGS

Regular Council Meetings are held on the fourth Monday of each month at 7:00 p.m. in the Community Building. Work Sessions are held on the Wednesday prior to the Regular Council Meeting.

In Accordance with Georgia Open Meetings Law the City of Mountain Park:

- Whenever a quorum of the Council meets for the discussion or presentation of official business or takes official action, the meeting is open to the public.
- The Meeting Dates, Times and Agendas are posted at the Community Building and on our website at least 24 hours in advance of the open meeting.
- Minutes of all public meetings are kept in writing and are made available for public inspection no later than immediately following the next Council meeting.
- These minutes contain the names of the members present at the meeting, a description of each motion, and a record of all votes.
- These minutes are subject to the Open Records Law after approval, unless voluntarily released before approval.

PARKING PERMITS – Please remember to obtain a temporary parking permit from City Hall 24 hours prior to an event at your address. This permit allows for temporary parking along side city streets for a 24 hour period. The vehicles must be positioned off the street to allow for orderly flow of traffic. It does not allow parking in front of fire hydrants, blocking of driveways or intersections. It does not diminish the rights of nearby property owners regarding trespassing.

DISPOSE OF HAZARDOUS MATERIALS PROPERLY

In November of 2005 the City of Mountain Park adopted an ordinance prohibiting illicit discharges to the storm water system. To paraphrase the ordinance: No person shall throw, drain, or otherwise discharge, any pollutants or waters containing pollutants, other than storm water into the city storm sewer system. Please do your part to keep Mountain Park clean and beautiful.

Please dispose of all your hazardous materials properly. Please report any violations or improper disposal of pollutants and hazardous material to City Hall 770-993-4231. Together we can make a difference.

TIME TO SWIM- GET YOUR POOL TAGS AT CITY HALL!

Pool Tag Registration INFO- 2013

Adults are considered 18 years and older.

Adults 60 years and older receive \$5 off their season pass

Children are considered ages 3 to 17: 2 and under Free

All children 11 and under must be accompanied by a Paid Adult

In order to qualify for a family pass, individuals must be immediate family members who live at the same residence (maximum of two adults) and all the children must be under the age of 18 OR 21 with a 2013 school ID (maximum of four children) and related to one or both of the adults as offspring or by marriage, adoption and foster care placement or legal guardianship.

\$6 Daily Passes cannot be applied to season passes.

Passes may be revoked for pool infractions and misuse with no refunds.

The pool is not responsible for lost or stolen season passes. A replacement fee of \$10.00 per tag will be charged. Any pass reported stolen or lost, and later found to be used will be subject to Criminal prosecution.

No FREE DAYS

Everyone entering the pool gated area must have a pool pass.

The concession area is closed, except for authorized personnel. No refrigerator or microwave is available to the public.

This year fire department members' family and current city employees (IDs required) get the same rates as residents.

Punch cards are available to residents or property owners only, at a cost of \$45.00 per card. The card holds 10 punches.

MORE HOURS TO SWIM PASSES ARE AVAILABLE \$20 PLUS \$10 for (key \$10 is nonrefundable) see additional paperwork.

There will be wifi available at the pool this year!!

Resident - \$55.00 Adult - \$45.00 Child - \$220.00 Family (2 Adult and up to 3 children per household)
