APPROVAL OF MEETING MINUTES

Murphy moved to the waive the reading and adopt the minutes of the Regular Council Meeting of April 22, 2019. 2nd by Carlson. Approved 5-0-0.

ADOPT MEETING AGENDA

Belser moved to adopt the agenda as presented. 2nd by DeLaSalle. Belser moved to amend the motion to adopt to include discussion of extended pool hours. 2nd by DeLaSalle. Approved 5-0-0.

MAYOR'S REPORT

Still stated the city was hosting the next NFMA meeting; however, it may be canceled.

Still thanked not only DeLaSalle for his work on the green, but also thanked Chad Rhyne and Brian Davis for the work getting the parking lot cleaned up.

Still stated the Farmers Market was still being held every Tuesday from 4-7 p.m. on the green.

Stated announced his attendance, as well as Segars', at a State of Fulton County event held in Atlanta.

COUNCIL REPORTS

Carlson stated he attended the Partners in Progress meeting and that North Fulton is doing great economically. He also noted a study showed the white population decreasing with North Fulton becoming more ethnically diversified. Still asked if anyone mentioned how the "heartbeat bill" may impact the movie industry but Carlson declined.

CITY HALL

Segars stated she had recently recertified as a Municipal Court Clerk through the Office of the Courts. She advised she was working with code enforcement of several contentious code violations and there were approximately three building permits. She noted pool tags had gone on sale; however Fulton County had failed the pool upon inspection and through working with Commissioner Ellis' office the city was able to obtain a grace period to work out an issue of having a land line or VOIP, if approved by Fulton County. Segars stated a tentative date had been set with Rowell for 5/29 provided James Dame was available and noted Roswell also suggested our city attorney attend. Upon discussion, Belser stated he wanted Bowen to attend the meeting.

PRESENTATIONS

UNFINISHED BUSINESS

1. Award of Bid for Trash/Recycle Pick-Up to Waste Pro in the Amount of \$14.95 Per Month Per Household
Carlson moved to approve. 2nd by Ayers. Bowen noted a change from three year contract to one year, with automatic renewal upon satisfactory performance. Approved 5-0-0.

NEW BUSINESS

1. Approval of Agreement with Fulton County Tax Commissioner for Collection of City Taxes by Fulton County
This agreement provides for the Tax Commissioner to charge \$1 per parcel in addition to the already collection of 1% commission for collection of city taxes. Murphy moved to approve. 2nd by DeLaSalle. Approved 5-0-0.
2. Approval of Letter of Representation from Smith Welch in the Amount of \$500 for City Representation in Cherokee SDS Negotiations
Ayers moved to approve the letter and commit to \$500 for representation. 2nd by Murphy. Bowen noted paragraph three had been stricken from the agreement. Approved 5-0-0.
3. Extension of Pool Hours
Belser stated a request had been received to leave the pool open for children to swim until 8; with the adult swim until 9 but was concerned about the liability for the city of not having a guard on duty. 2nd by Carlson.

Sarah Buerhle, requestor, stated Highland Colony placed on "off duty" sign in the chair for swim at your own risk. Belser amended his motion to provide up to \$500 additional per month in the management contract. 2nd by Carlson. Approved 5-0-0.

Carol Silver asked for free entry to the swimming pool on May 25 for the Civic Club to host opening day and sell food. Council concurred.

Linda Dixon stated Laurel needed gravel stabilization and she would bring forth a recommendation at the next work session.

Lloyd Hendricks noted the flood of fisherman on Russell Road between Mountain Park Road and the bridge.

Murphy stated he would be out of town for the next two months but would be available for emergency phone calls.
