



## REMINDERS AND INFORMATION FOR MAY 2017

### KNOW YOUR CITY CODE



We are using this section of our newsletter to familiarize residents with content found in the official City Code book. We will periodically print selected sections. The City of Mountain Park has adopted as its Animal Control Ordinance, the Fulton County Animal Control Ordinance.

#### Animal Ordinance:

- Generally – running at large dogs, domestic animals, etc., dangerous or potentially dangerous dogs is prohibited with the exception of cats.
- Dogs – unlawful for owner, custodian or harbinger of any dog to allow such dog to leave the premises or the owner or other such person having custody unless dog is under security of leash being no more than 6 feet in length and under the control of a competent person. Dogs must be confined to the premises of the owner or other person having custody and must be restrained by means of a fence or wall or other enclosure.
- Restraint of domestic animals – it shall be unlawful for owner, custodian or harbinger of any domestic animal to allow or permit such animal to leave the premises of the owner or other person having custody unless securely under leash, carry case or restrained by some other means and under the control of a competent person.

Please be advised we are in a Level II Drought as designated by the Georgia EPD. Following are some helpful **Water Conservation Tips**

Metro Atlantans can take many steps both inside and outside the home to conserve water. These tips will also help to save money.

Outside the home:

- Only water lawns and plants if they need it. More plants die in Georgia from overwatering than underwatering. One inch of rain or water every 7-10 days is all your plants need.
- Adjust sprinklers so only your lawn is watered and not the house, sidewalk or street.
- Install a rain sensor so your system won't run when it's raining.
- Landscape with native plants or plants well adapted to our region.
- Water the base of the plant instead of leaves. This saves water and reduces disease.
- Group plants with the same watering needs together.
- Use a broom instead of a hose to clean your driveway, sidewalk and deck.

Inside the home:

- Reduce your shower by two minutes and you can save five gallons of water per shower.
- Turn off the water while you shave or brush your teeth and you can save at least 100 gallons a week.
- Check your toilet for leaks. Put food color in your toilet tank and wait 10 minutes. If it seeps into your toilet bowl, you have a leak.
- Scrape your dishes instead of rinsing before placing in the dishwasher, and you can save six gallons a day.
- Limit dishwashing to FULL loads, and you can save at least two gallons a load.
- Use the refrigerator to thaw frozen food.
- Fix leaky faucets as soon as you notice them. A leak of 60 drips a minute wastes 192 gallons a month.
- Do only FULL loads of laundry. Cutting back one load of laundry can save up to 45 gallons per load.
